VBC has developed a statement of faith that every Committee member, the administration, teacher, employee, and student associated with VCA must read, understand, sign, and comply with to remain in good standing. The Church's doctrinal statement has been adopted, without change, by VCA. The Essentials of Faith, as taught at VCA, are consistent with evangelical theology and are important points of unity with all believers. The Distinctives are consistent with the teaching of VBC and in no way are at odds with any of the Essentials of Faith. All have clear, frequent Biblical support.

We believe the Old and New Testaments to be inerrant in their original writings and were given by inspiration of God to provide a complete revelation of His will for the salvation of men. They make up the divine and only rule of Christian faith and practice. - II Timothy 3:16-17

We believe there is one God, who is infinitely perfect, existing eternally in three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.- Luke 3:21-22

We believe in Jesus Christ, who is fully human and fully divine. He is the only begotten Son of God, full of grace and truth, conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin, Mary.-John 3:16

We believe that the Holy Spirit is a divine person, sent to indwell, guide, teach, empower the believer, and convince the world of sin, of righteousness, and the judgment.-John 16:7-8

We believe that man was created in the likeness and image of God, and that he fell through disobedience, thereby incurring both spiritual and physical death. All men are born with a sinful nature, are separated from the life of God, and can be saved only through the atoning work of Jesus Christ.

We believe that salvation has been provided through Jesus Christ for all men; those who repent and believe in Him are born again of the Holy Spirit, receive the gift of eternal life, and become the children of God. -Acts 3:19-30

We believe that Jesus Christ died upon a cross, the just for the unjust, as a substitutionary sacrifice, and all who believe on Him are justified on the ground of His shed blood.-I Peter 3:18

We believe that Jesus Christ was bodily raised up from the dead according to the Scriptures, and has ascended to sit at the right hand of the Father in heaven. From there He ever lives to make intercession for His saints as our High Priest and Advocate. -Romans 8:3-4

We believe in the personal, imminent return of Jesus Christ to establish His kingdom of righteousness and peace. -John 14:1-4

We believe that Jesus Christ is the head of the Church, which is made up of all those who believe on Him, are redeemed through His blood, and are born again of the Holy Spirit. -Colossians 1:18

We believe the family is the basic unit of society established by God, Who intends for it to consist of a man and a woman legally married to each other in a permanent relationship, which may or may not produce children. If the man and woman have children, they are responsible to train and teach those children in biblical principles. Any sexual activity outside of the marriage covenant is an abomination before God. -Genesis 2:24; Deuteronomy 6:6-7; Romans 7:2; I Corinthians 7:10; Ephesians 5:22-23

Application for Admissions Process

Step 1 - Online Application Submission and Supporting Documentation

Complete the VCA Application located on our website

VCANC.com > Admissions > Click here to apply for Admission > Click Create an Account > Enter District Code **VCA-NC** and your email address.

You will need to create a FACTS account first before you can begin the application.

Select the appropriate application, either Kinder or 1st-12th.

Upload copies of the following documents

Please note: You must scan and save multiple page documents to one (1) pdf/file to upload for each requested document.

Applications that do not contain correct uploads will be returned and unable to be processed. Thank you for your careful attention.

1. Birth Certificate
2. Social Security Card
3. Current immunization record provided by their physician.
4. Current Report Card (Grades 1st - 12th)
5. Current Transcript (Grades 9th - 12th)
6. Copy of recent standardized test scores
7. Enter the name and email for the pastor recommendation form.
8. Enter the name and email for the teacher recommendation form.
9. Copy of any custody documentation is needed if the student does not live with both biological parents.
10. **If the student has a IEP/504 please contact the admissions office prior to applying**

Step 2 - Pay the non-refundable application fee of \$150.

**Kindergarten Applicants Only will be screened for kindergarten readiness by one of our teachers. If a decision is made to move forward in the process, the screening results will be reviewed during the student/parent interview.

Once the student application is complete and all required documentation has been received by the Admissions Department, a determination will be made regarding continuation in the admissions process.

Step 3 - Parent & Student Interview with Respective School Principal.

1. Families of students moving forward in the admissions process will be contacted to schedule the parent and student interview with the appropriate principal.
2. Applicants who will not continue in the process will receive a denial email.

Step 4 - Student Acceptance

1. You may be notified at the conclusion of the interview of acceptance, or denial or an acceptance/denial letter will be emailed to you.
2. If acceptance is offered at the conclusion of the interview and accepted you will be given an acceptance form to sign.
3. Once this form is signed you will meet with the finance department to discuss payment options.

Step 5 - Set up your FACTS Finance Account and Tuition Agreement.

PLEASE NOTE THAT ALL OF THE ABOVE 5 STEPS ARE REQUIRED TO SECURE YOUR STUDENT'S SPOT AND FINALIZE YOUR ENROLLMENT.

Please note: Any student who is withdrawn (dismissed) from any school due to academic and/or disciplinary reasons must wait one calendar year before making an application for re-enrollment or admission to Village Christian Academy. All admissions are tentative pending final approval by the Admissions Committee.

Withdrawal Fee - \$500 will be charged per student who withdraw

FACTS Accounts/Payment Plans

- 10-month and 12-month billing plans through FACTS are available.
- 10-month billing plans must be established on or before **7/21/2026**
- 12-month billing (includes \$390.00 resource & \$125.00 security fee) must be established on or before **5/19/2026.**
- All families must create a FACTS account regardless of payment method. FACTS will not require bank information or a set-up fee if tuition is paid in full. FACTS assesses an annual fee of \$55.00 for all monthly payment plans. All families are required to have an automatic payment plan set up for their monthly payment plans. The financial account must be active at all times. Failure to comply may result in the withdrawal of students under that account.

Discounts

Multi-Child Discount: 11% discount for the 2nd child, and 23% for each additional child enrolled.

Paid-In-Full Discount: 1% of base tuition will be discounted if tuition is paid (cash or check only) in full by
